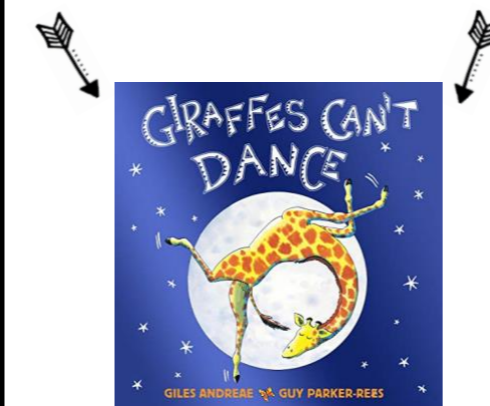
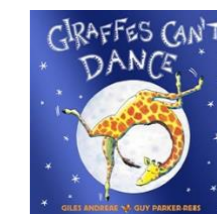
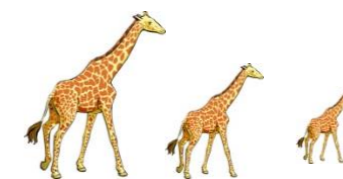
Can you click on the picture below and have a go the LIRA questions?

Gerald was different to the other animals, think about what makes you different? Is it just your looks that are different to other people? Just like Gerald you should be proud to be different!

You could ask other family members to contribute to this too and record a list of your child's individual qualities together.



Talk to your child about the friendships they have made this year. Who is important to them and why? What are they going to miss most about their teacher/teachers? Support your child to draw around their hand on paper and then carefully cut it out. On the template, ask your child to draw or write a goodbye message to a friend or teacher.
